THE DOG CONTROL ORDER (PROCEDURES) REGULATIONS 2006

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that West Lancashire Borough Council has on 16th June 2009 made a **Dog Control Order** pursuant to its powers under the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005.

The Order will come into force on 3rd July 2009

The Order will apply to the enclosed children's play areas listed and described in the attached Schedule.

The Order – The Dogs Exclusion (West Lancashire) Order 2009

Purpose

This Order will make it an offence to take or allow a dog in your control to enter onto any land to which the Order applies.

Scope

This Order will apply to all the land mentioned above. The Order will be in force on a '24 hours a day' basis.

Exemptions

This Order will not apply to a person who is registered blind or to those who are disabled and use trained assistance dogs.

Penalties

The penalty in relation to any offence in the above Dog Control Order is a fixed penalty notice of £75 to be paid within 14 days.

If the Penalty Notice is not paid or is not appropriate West Lancashire Borough Council may prosecute the offender in the Magistrates Court. A person who is guilty of this offence shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale.

Copies of this Order and maps of the affected areas will be kept at the offices of the Council at 52 Derby Street, Ormskirk and will be available for viewing on any weekday during the usual office hours and online at the Councils website.

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AND PENALTIES ETC) REGULATIONS 2006
THE DOG CONTROL ORDER (PROCEDURES)
REGULATIONS 2006**

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that West Lancashire Borough Council has on 16th June 2009 made **3 Dog Control Orders** pursuant to its powers under the Clean Neighbourhoods and Environment Act 2005.

The Orders will come into force on 3rd July 2009

Orders 1 & 2 will apply to all land that is within the administrative area of West Lancashire Borough Council and in which the public are entitled or permitted to have access with or without payment. The Orders will also apply to all Access Land within the Borough of West Lancashire*.

Order 3 will apply to carriageways in the West Lancashire Borough Council Area (either public or to which the public have access with or without payment) with a speed limit of 40 miles per hour or greater and the adjoining footways, cycle tracks and verges.

Order 1 – The Dogs (Specified Maximum) (West Lancashire) Order 2009

Purpose

This Order will make it an offence to take more than six dogs onto any land to which the Order applies.

Order 2 – The Dogs on Leads by Direction (West Lancashire) Order 2009

Purpose

This Order will make it an offence not to comply with a direction by an authorised officer of the Council to put and keep a dog on a lead where such restraint is reasonably necessary to prevent a nuisance or annoyance or disturbance to any other person, animal or bird on any land to which the Order applies.

Order 3 – The Dogs on Leads (West Lancashire) Order 2009

Purpose

This Order will make it an offence not to keep a dog in your control on a lead on any land to which this Order applies.

Scope of the Orders

These 3 Orders will apply to the land as mentioned above and will be in force on a '24 hours a day' basis.

Penalties

The penalty in relation to any offence in the above 3 Orders is a fixed penalty notice of £75 to be paid within 14 days.

If the Penalty Notice is not paid or is not appropriate West Lancashire Borough Council may prosecute the offender in the Magistrates Court. A person who is guilty of this offence shall be liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding level 3 on the standard scale.

Copies of all 3 Orders will be kept at the offices of the Council at 52 Derby Street, Ormskirk and will be available for viewing on any weekday during the usual office hours and online at the Council's website.

* "Access Land" as defined by the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000 is land shown as open countryside on a map produced by an appropriate countryside body, registered common land, land situated more than 600 metres above sea level in areas where no open country map has been issued and land which has been dedicated as such by the Countryside and Rights of Way Act 2000.
